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Officially marking our 5th anniversary in May this year, SprinNG continued to demonstrate its passion for empowering new Nigerian generations in writing and literature. We are grateful to all those who have contributed to making SprinNG successful this year. We are

Here is a summary of our accomplishments in 2021 and outlook for 2022.

SprinNG Publications: In 2021, we published a total of 53 items on our website, garnering about 200 comments, 19,000 unique views, and 38,000 page visits. We particularly highlighted the voices of our fellowship alumni by selecting 7 writers for specific months and publishing three of their works per month. We also increased our social media following by 15% with the addition of the SprinNG Women Authors Prize media (@the_SWAPng).

Looking forward to 2022, we have an open call for submissions to the public with few restrictions, allowing more writers to be celebrated through our platform. To learn more and submit, visit: www.sprinng.org/submit-to-us. The submission deadline is January 31, 2022.















Anthologies: This year, an additional avenue for submissions and publications to other writers



was through anthologies published by SprinNG. We published two anthologies: *To Borrow Screams from the Atmosphere* and *We Are Deathless*. In addition, before the end of this year, we will publish the 2021 SprinNG Writing Fellowship anthology.

About *We are Deathless*: The narrative surrounding the black identity remains a single story of strife and pain. Edited by Wale Ayinla and Kanyinsola Olorunnisola, We Are Deathless: An Afropoetry Anthology is poets' response to that.

We aim for a new narrative with many black voices speaking their truths in unison. Blackness is no monolith; it exists in various forms, and we want works that acknowledge its cultural, religious, ideological, and sexual diversity.



2021 SprinNG Fellowship's Anthology including 'Why I Write' Essays: This anthology represents the 2021 cohort with writings by 20 of the 44 writers accepted into the fellowship's fifth cohort, 41 of which completed the programme requirements. The SprinNG Fellowships



The SprinNG Writing Fellowship: The SprinNG Writing Fellowship is an intensive 6-week online mentorship programme for developing writers with great potential and willingness to learn. Select participants of the fellowship are paired with top contemporary writers to receive



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feedback continually on their work. In 2021, we expanded the writing fellowship to Ghana, promoting African inclusivity and network among the writers in our program.

Here is the engagement history in our SprinNG Writing fellowship:

- In January 2018, 9 completed the fellowship.
- In August 2018, 20 completed the fellowship.
- In 2019, 25 completed the fellowship.
- In 2020, 48 writers completed the fellowship.
- In 2021, 41 writers completed the fellowship.

This year, we received 567 applications for the SprinNG Writing fellowship. As a result, we accepted 44 mentees into the programme, 41 completed the fellowship requirements and received their certifications. In addition, 40 mentors volunteered for this year's fellowship.

Career Development At Your Fingertips



The SprinNG Advancement Fellowship: Our 2020 report stated that we will modify the SprinNG Advancement Fellowship (SAF) into an all-year-round mentorship module and platform for Nigerian creatives and non-creatives in the country and beyond to improve their career development skills.

The SprinNG Advancement Fellowship (SAF) is a self-paced (4 weeks) programme that helps individuals develop career content and improve their professional communication skills to attain academic and career goals. The fellowship covers six core courses: Resume/ CV Writing, Cover Letter Writing, Personal Statement Writing, Interview Preparation, Answering Interview Questions, and S.M.A.R.T Goal-Setting. The fellowship costs N25,000 only.

Fellowship participants are provided concise learning materials, including videos, worksheets, short guides, and assignments to build their career portfolio for pursuing opportunities like jobs,



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internships, fellowships, university admissions, and more. In addition, they will receive feedback and guidance from SprinNG to perfect their career content and stand out.

We ran the SprinNG Advancement fellowship twice this year, in August and October. In August, 7 participants completed the SprinNG Advancement fellowship: 4 being scholarship recipients from the 2021 SprinNG Writing Fellowship. In November, 3 participants completed the fellowship.

The application for the SprinNG Advancement Fellowship will open again in 2022 three times during the year: March, July, and November. Further announcements will be on this page in 2022: www.sprinng.org/advancement-fellowship



SprinNG Resume/CV Clinic: Compared to the month-long Advancement Fellowship, the SprinNG Resume/CV Clinic is a self-paced (1 week) program that helps develop only Resume/CVs. It is a portion of the SprinNG Advancement Fellowship (SAF) and costs only N5,000. Likewise, it is self-paced, including a 30-minute video, handouts, and a template/guide. In addition, individuals will receive advice to improve and finalize their resumes/CV.

The SprinNG Resume/CV Clinics will run 4 times in 2022: January, April, May, and September. More announcements will be made on our website, via email, and social media.

The SprinNG Women Authors Prize (SWAP): SWAP selects a Female Nigerian Author annually - someone who has published a full-length book in print and invests N200,000 in purchasing, distributing, and marketing copies of their book nationwide through our sister literary websites and events with whom we collaborate.

SWAP's first winner (2020), Cheluchi Onyemelukwe-Onuobia, Author of The Son of the House, was announced in January 2021. She also won the \$100,000 NLNG Literature Award for 2021 that was announced October 2021. We are very proud of Cheluchi's accomplishments and wish her further success with her debut book – *The Son of the House*.
