


Summary




OUR YEAR-ON-YEAR IMPACT DIGITAL ENGAGEMENT





The mentorship aspect of the fellowship is the most thoughtful. IMPACT BEYOND

From 2020 - 2022, through the support of a cosponsor, Sprinng established an initiative to increase the visibility of female Nigerian writers by promoting their books. The Sprinng Women Authors Prize (SWAP) awarded #1,000,000 in total to 4 winners.

DESCRIPTION OF

OUR CURRENT PROJECTS



We are taking Sprinng to the next level through collaborative innovation and effective program strategy!

This year, the Sprinng Board of Directors and team are focused on spreading the news of our impact to raise funds for our core projects. Our overall focus is expanding our projects' audience to Africa through application qualifications, marketing, and collaboration with international literary platforms.

01. FELLOWSHIPS

We conduct an annual Sprinng Writing Fellowship (SWF), providing 6-weeks of free mentorship to select writers with resources such as airtime, paid access to books, and more. In 2024, our fellowship will be for writers (South African, Nigerian, Ghanaian, and Liberian - ages 16-25) who haven't published a book.

On the other hand, the Sprinng Advancement Fellowship (SAF) is a comprehensive and FREE MFA application support system designed to empower and guide African writers through the application process. Select participants will begin with free access to Sprinng's online training platform with a transformative 3-week program where our expert team will provide personalized support to enhance their application materials (resume and essays). Then, fellows will be paired with a dedicated mentor providing 2 weeks of guidance on their writing sample.

02. PUBLICATIONS

We are thriving with a mailing list of over 9,000 literary enthusiasts and strong engagement, including over 240k page views and almost 3,000 comments demonstrating an active engagement with our writers published monthly on our website.

03. ANNUAL POETRY CONTEST

We run an annual poetry contest with a unique theme to celebrate our anniversary. This poetry contest is in collaboration with Nigerian News Direct's Poetry Column for 2024, spotlighting writers interested in showcasing their work to a large audience.

As Sprinng grows, we will establish more expanded and grassroots publishing opportunities developing writers, leveraging our platform for their community accessibility and global reach.



EXPANSION ACROSS AFRICA


By 2030, Sprinng will reach more than 25,000 writers across Africa through our social media and newsletters, engaging them with expanded programs and helping them transition to their unique paths within and beyond the literary industry.

Through our fellowships, we have reached writers in Nigeria, South Africa, and Ghana, expanding to Liberia in 2024. We will continue having 75+ fellows annually with progressive expansion across Africa. By 2030, we will have mentored at least 1,000 writers in our fellowships.

INCREASING REPRESENTATION

We are creating a shared space for many young African writers to grow the skills needed to start or continue making impact within their communities and beyond. We don't just want to provide solutions; we are developing the next generation of African literature leaders whose intentions, words, and actions will frame and change the literary arts and publishing landscape. We will connect them with intimate gatherings and networking events to co-innovators and sponsors who value their efforts and align with their dreams.
